

Penguin Coaster – Beginner

By On Fisher's Hook

US terms

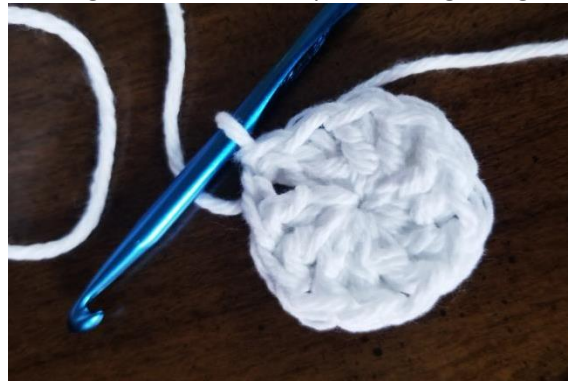
Materials = medium (4) weight yarn
White (color 1) ~3g,
Black (color 2) ~4g
Orange (color 3) <1g
Yellow (color 4) <.5g
5mm (H) crochet hook
Scissors
Darning needle

Stitches used ml – Magic Loop
St(s) – stitches
Ch – chain
Slst – slip stitch
Sc – single crochet
Hdc – half double crochet
dc – double crochet
tc – treble crochet
sk – skip

Note: Ch3 will count as a stitch. The wings and body are made in one continuous row (row 4)

To begin: With color 1, create a magic loop. Ch3 (will count as 1dc)

Row 1: 11dc into magic loop. Pull tight. Slst into the top of the beginning chain 3 to finish round 1. (12)



Row 2: Ch3. 1dc in same st as chain. 2dc in each remaining st. Insert hook to top of ch3 and slst change to color 2 to finish r2. (24)



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Row 3: With color 2, ch3. 1dc in the same st. [1dc in the next st. 2dc in the next st.] Repeat [] 11 times. 1dc in last st. Slst in top of ch3 to finish the row. (36)



Row 4:

(1st wing) Ch4. 2tc in the next st. 2dc in the next st. 1hdc in the next st. 1sc in next st. Slst the next 4sts. (head) 1sc in next st. 1hdc in next st. 2dc in the next st. 2tc in the next 2sts. 2dc in next st. 1hdc in next st. 1sc in next st. 4slst in next 4sts.

(2nd wing) 1 sc in next st. 1hdc in next st. 2dc in next st. 2tc in the next st. 1tc in the next st. (10 sts left unworked.) Fasten off and sew in ends.



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Feet.

In the bottom 10 unworked sts, attach color 3 into 4th st, ch2. 2hdc in the same st. In the next st, 2hdc and 1slst. In next st, 1slst then 2hdc. 3hdc in the next st. Fasten off and sew in ends.



Beak.

Thread color 4 through darning needle. For beak placement, use the two pairs of treble crochets in the head section as the center. Below those where the color 2 meets color 1 there should be 3 stitches. Thread color 4 from back to front across those three stitches to make two horizontal rows. Then, use the center stitch between those in row 2 as the point of a v and sew 4 vertical lines across the horizontal ones in a v shape. Knot in the back and sew in ends. Works best if you thread through the stitches instead of in between the stitches.



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
