One Skein Knitted/Woven Scarf By Angora BunnyWorks

You'll need:

Persimmon Tree Farm Barnyard Yarn (mohair/alpaca/wool blend), DK, 4 oz, 300 yard skein (or) 300 yards of a similar DK weight yarn. Size US 8 Knitting Needles Stitch Holders and/or waste yarn

Gauge: 18 stitches/14 rows = 4" 13WPI



I wrote this in plain English without a lot of knitting pattern terminology to help a friend who can't read a pattern yet.

RIBBING (1) Cast on 30 stitches Do a ribbing pattern of your choice. I did K4P1 Rib across for 50 rows

WEAVING (1)

Next, you'll make your weaving strips. I made eight 5-stitch strips, but you can make fewer strips that are wider keeping in mind you have 30 stitches total to work with. Stockinette stitch across the first 5 stitches for 35 rows, then remove those 5 stitches onto a stitch holder or waste yarn. Let the strip drop down out of the way and continue to make another strip on the next 5 stitches. Remove onto a stitch holder and continue for each group of 5 stitches. When done, I spread the scarf out on a flat surface so I could

check for twisting, get strips in the right order and make sure the top of the strip had the correct side (purl) facing up so I could load my 30 stitches back on the needle.

AROUND THE NECK

In stockinette stitch, do 98 rows across all 30 stitches.

WEAVING STRIPS (2)

Return to WEAVING STRIPS (1) and repeat. After making the strips, I again put the scarf on a flat surface. The strips from WEAVING STRIPS (2) are woven into the strips made in WEAVING STRIPS (1). Make sure the strips are un-twisted, are in the correct order, and the end of the strips from WEAVING STRIPS (2) are purl side up. When you're ready, load the 30 stitches back onto the needle.

RIBBING (2)

Repeating the ribbing you did in RIBBING (1) doing it across all 30 needles for 50 rows. When done, bind off.
